REMINDERS: PLAGIARISM



The act of presenting another person's intellectual property or work as one's own work (i.e. written words, ideas, visual images, auditory expressions or any text based, electronic, internet or AI generated material that comes from another source), without crediting the source of that material.

Even material that has been paraphrased in the student's own words is considered plagiarised material unless proper creditor explicit reference is given. A student should not copy another person's homework, copy directly from the internet, look at another person's paper and copy their answers.
