



#### MUN Delegates in Action at MEDIMUN 2025!



From 7-9 February, our Model United Nations Club proudly participated in the 20th Annual Session of MEDIMUN, an event that brought together 500 delegates across 7 committees, supported by hundreds of dedicated volunteers.

Our delegates engaged in dynamic debates on critical global issues, including the impact of Artificial Intelligence on society, conflicts and war and - for the first time - in an International Court of Justice case. This unique experience allowed students to step into the roles of diplomats and legal experts, refining their public speaking, negotiation and leadership skills.

Events like MEDIMUN are invaluable in fostering the minds of the young generation, encouraging them to think critically, collaborate and develop problem-solving skills that will shape them into future global leaders. By engaging in diplomacy, law and policy discussions, students gain real-world experience that prepares them to drive positive change in society.
